LCLD RECOGNIZES ARMSTRONG TEASDALE AS 2022 TOP PERFORMER AND COMPASS AWARD WINNER

The Top Performer award recognizes those organizations in the top 20 percent for participation in LCLD programs and activities. The Compass Award recognizes those individuals and organizations that fulfill all of the following requirements in a single calendar year:

- Member attendance at the LCLD Annual Membership Meeting and/or Member attendance at a Leadership Summit and/or submission of a Leader's Pledge.
- Participation in the LCLD Fellows and Pathfinder Programs.
- Participation in an LCLD Pipeline program (the 1L Scholars program or the Success in Law School Mentoring Program).

"Both of these designations are representative of our ongoing focus on DEI, at the firm through our strategic goals, and in the broader profession," said Managing Partner <u>Patrick Rasche</u>. "We are committed to building vital links with clients and colleagues on DEI and taking a collaborative approach to drive meaningful change."

This is the third time Armstrong Teasdale has earned the organization's Compass Award, and the second time the firm has earned the Top Performer award.
