It is with a heavy heart that we share the very sad news of <u>Andrew Fleming's</u> passing last Friday evening. He was a devoted husband and father, as well as a wonderful partner, colleague, and friend. For 35 years, Andrew was a vital part of Novack and Macey and the past year, a Partner in Armstrong Teasdale's Chicago office. His passion for practicing law and dedication to high-stakes litigious disputes were truly unparalleled. We will miss him deeply.

Last week, we learned that Andrew had been privately battling lung cancer and liver issues while in hospice care. As many of you know, he was a fighter and expressed confidence in his recovery. His eagerness to return to work was a testament to his commitment to our firm and his passion for life. Sadly, that will not come to pass.

With one foot in the U.K. (Premier League football), and the other in the U.S. (Chicago Bears football), Andrew had a true international background. He also devoted significant time to Mission Outreach, a warehouse facility near Midway Airport that sorts and packs medical supplies donated by hospitals and distributes them to those in need worldwide.
